What is PSHE?

PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education) enables children to become healthier, more independent and more responsible members of society.

Foundation Stage:

The teaching of PSHE fits in to the curriculum area of PSE (Personal, Social and Emotional).

Key Stage 1:

PSHE is taught every term as a discrete subject but the aims and objectives are addressed throughout the entire school curriculum and underlie every aspect of children's lives.

Drugs Education and Sex and Relationships Education is addressed through Jigsaw PSHE lessons as well as Science Topic work.

- Know and understand what is meant by a healthy lifestyle
- Be aware of safety issues
- Understand what makes for good relationships with others
- Have respect for others
- Be thoughtful and responsible members of their school and their community
- Become active members of our democratic society
- Develop self-confidence and selfesteem
- Make informed choices regarding personal and social issues
- Develop good relationships with other members of the community

- Let them talk you through crossing the road safely, when you are outside.






