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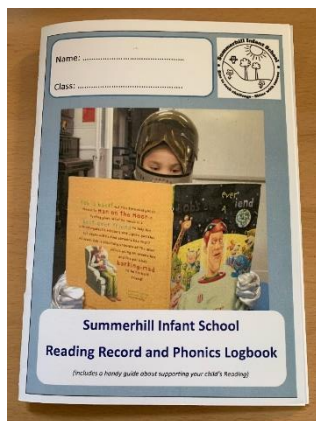

### RWI stickers no longer in reading logs from Term 4

Children on the Read Write Inc (RWI) phonics programme are given a new book every week by their RWI teacher to read with you at home. Currently, a sticker, such as the example below, is stuck into your child's reading log to signal that they have a new RWI book in their book bag to share with you.

We are writing to let you know that **these stickers will no longer be stuck in your child's reading log from Term 4 onwards**, in order to make sure we are using RWI time to its full potential – teaching phonics and reading skills at every available opportunity throughout the RWI sessions. If your child is still on the RWI programme, **they will continue to get a new RWI book in their book bag every Friday** unless they have not returned their old book or we are in the process of changing RWI groups (your child's RWI teacher will keep a log of which books have been borrowed from school). **Please make sure you keep all your child's reading books from school in their book bag every day so they are able to be changed regularly.**

**We kindly ask parents/carers to continue to listen to your child read their RWI book at least 3 times a week, sign their reading log in the 'comments' box and write the date and title of the book.** Your child's class teacher will continue to write the titles of any additional books they are given, that aren't distributed in RWI sessions, in your child's reading log. A reminder that reading the same book across the week builds your child's fluency and confidence.

We thank you for your continued support with developing your child's reading – reading together on a regular basis really does make a huge difference.
