






Word Reading

In Reception children learn the sounds that the letters make, then blend the sounds together in order to read words.






Read Write Inc Groups



High Frequency Words

Certain words in the English language cannot be decoded or blended. These specific words need to be learned. We are providing sets of these words for you to practice at home with your child. Once they have mastered these words, they will receive a certificate and the next set of four words. The words will be presented in the order they appear in the Read Write Inc books.



End of Year Aspirations

We are halfway through the Reception Year. At the end of the year the teachers have to make a statutory judgement about whether each child has met the Early Learning Goals in each area of learning.

Word Reading

Children at the expected level of development will:

Say a sound for each letter in the alphabet and at least 10 digraphs;

Read words consistent with their phonic knowledge by sound-blending;

Read aloud simple sentences and books that are consistent with their phonic knowledge, including some common exception words.
