Record or perform a pretend weather report for Antarctica. Use vocabulary like blizzard, freezing, and sub-zero.	Research an animal that lives in Antarctica and create a song—like the penguin rap. https://www.youtube.com/ watch?v=6HTu3qspiYQ	Use boxes, cotton wool, paper, and plastic animals to build a small 3D Antarctic landscape, showing icebergs, penguins, and glaciers.
