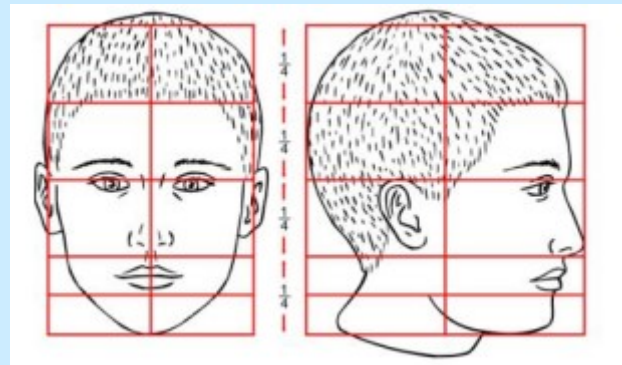

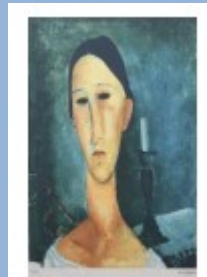

## Subject Specific Vocabulary

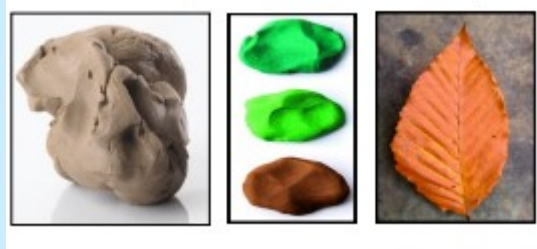
word	definition
Artwork	A piece of art, such as painting, collage or sculpture.
Manmade objects	Things that are made by humans
Natural Objects	Things that are not manmade, but found in the world around us, such as stones, leaves and twigs.
Sculpture	A piece of solid (3D) art such as a statue which is not flat.
Materials/mediums	The things that an artist uses to make an artwork.
Land art	A kind of sculpture made using natural materials, usually outside in a natural environment.

## Sticky Knowledge

Observe and draw natural objects, looking closely to represent lines, shapes and textures.



Materials that could be used are clay, plasticine, clay tools and found natural objects.

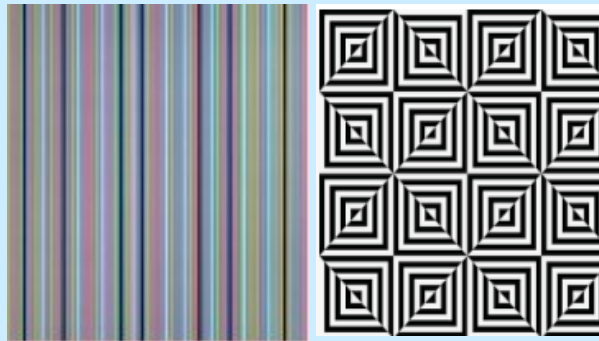

Bridget Riley is a modern artists from Britain. She is famous for using shapes and patterns in her work. She places these together in a way to create an optical illusion.



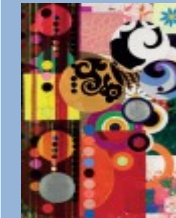
In order for Bridget to make her work she needs to use a lot of different lines. Some of the lines she uses are:

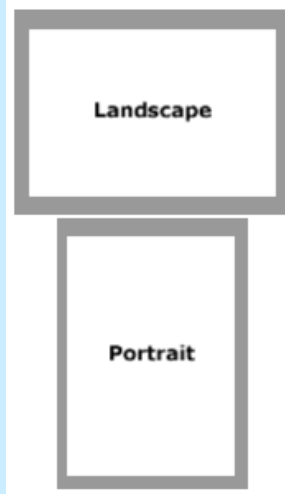

- Pastel colours are soft, light colours.

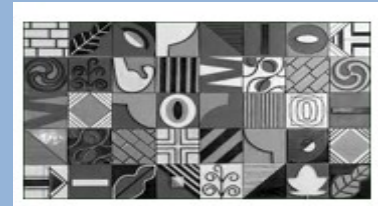


Clarice Cliff was an English ceramic artist and designer. Active from 1922 to 1963 she designed a lot of decorative plates.
