

Why is Jesus important (to Christians)

Children learn some facts about the life of Jesus. What do these tell us about how to be a good person? They explore some stories about Jesus from the Bible.

How should we live our lives?

Children compare religious and non-religious stories and discuss what we can learn from them. They explore the story of Moses and the 10 commandments. They find out about the festival of Yom Kippur.

Why are some stories special?

In this enquiry the children learn about the holy books from each faith and some information about the importance of each text.

Why are some places special?

Building on learning about Places of worship in Reception, Year One children begin to recognise some religious symbols that are important to different faiths. Children begin to describe different places of worship and what might happen inside them.



Where do we belong?

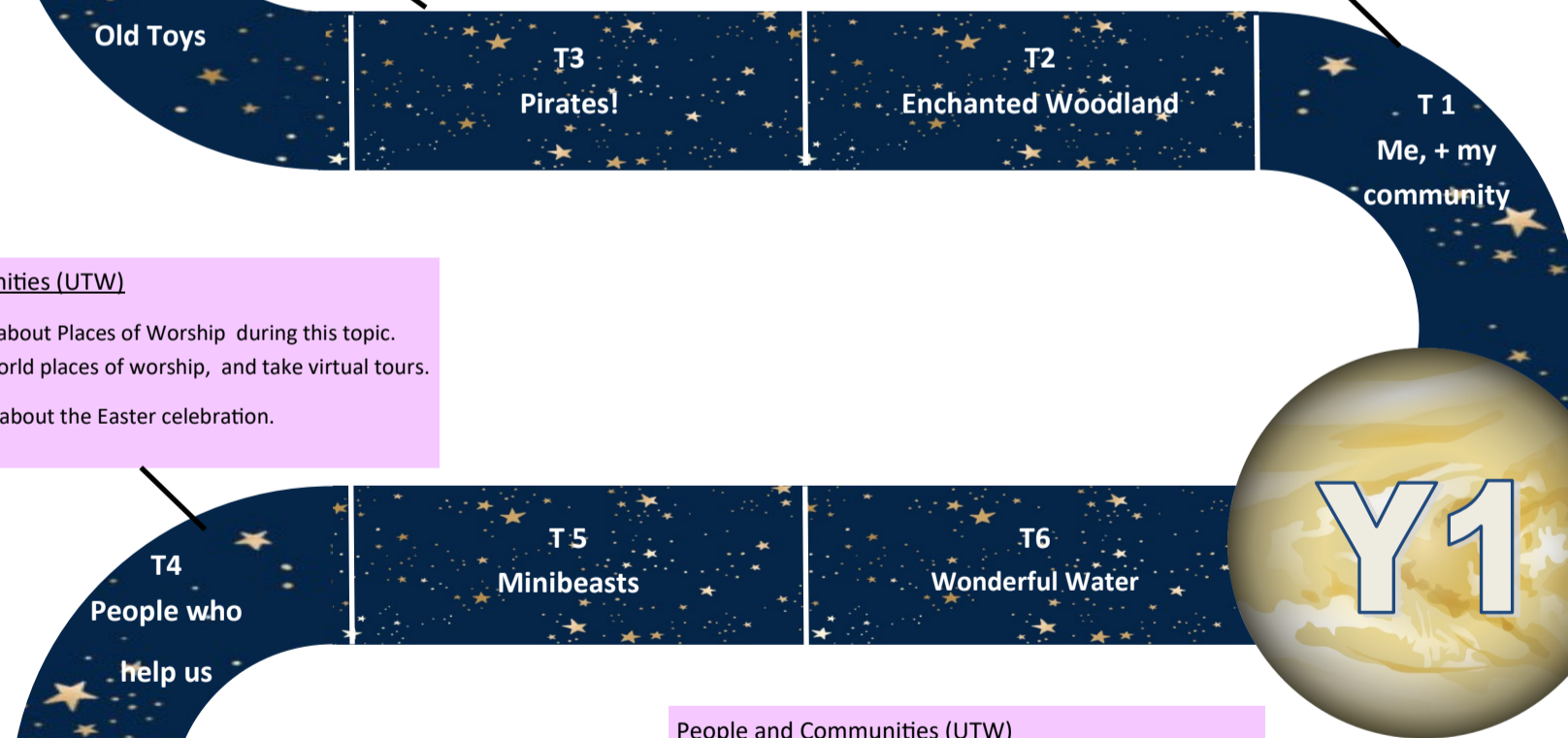
Children consider what it means to belong, to a family, a community and a faith. To find out about significant festivals for both Christian and Muslim people. The children then explore Christian baptism, the importance of prayer to Muslims and Shabbat in the Jewish faith.

How do we celebrate our journey through life?

Children identify important events in their lives. They learn about how a baby might be welcomed into a family in a variety of faiths. They find out how weddings are celebrated and learn about a Wedding where Jesus performs his first miracle.

We continue learning about Places of Worship during this topic. We revisit the small world places of worship, and take virtual tours. We celebrate find out about the Easter celebration.

Children have opportunities to talk about themselves and their family members. They notice similarities and differences between themselves and others. We begin to talk about celebrations as children celebrate their birthdays.
