Subject Specific Vocabulary

word	definition
Drawing	A picture or diagram made with a pencil, pen, or crayon rather than paint.
Pencil	An instrument for writing or drawing, consisting of a thin stick of graphite or a similar substance enclosed in a long thin piece of wood.
Crayon	A pencil or stick of coloured chalk or wax, used for drawing.
Felt tip	A pen with a writing point made of felt or other tightly packed fibres.
Mark making	Describes the different lines, dots, marks, patterns and textures we create in an art-work.
Chalk	A white soft earthy limestone.
Patterns	A repeated decorative design.
Lines	A mark made using a drawing tool or brush.
Portrait	A drawing or painting of a persons face.
Self portrait	A portrait that an artist produces of themselves.

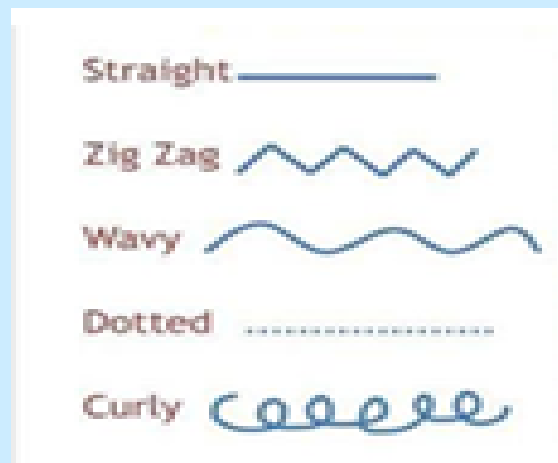
Sticky Knowledge

Subject Specific Vocabulary

word	definition
Texture	Texture is how something looks or feels.
Mix	Combining colours or materials .
Stick	Attach materials together .
Landscape	A picture of the outdoors.
Collage	Making artwork by cutting or tearing pictures, paper, or other materials and sticking them together to create a new picture or design.
Abstract	A kind of art where the picture doesn't have to look like real life, instead, it uses colours, shapes, and lines to show feelings or ideas.
Transient art	Art that is not fixed or permanent.
Loose parts	Loose parts are materials that can be moved, carried, combined, redesigned, lined up, and taken apart and put back together in multiple ways e.g. buttons, bottle lids, pine cones etc.

word	definition
Clay	Moist sticky earth.
Modelling	Working clay into a shape or form.
Scoring	Cutting or scratching the surface of clay.
Pinching	Squeezing between the thumb and finger.
Coiling	Fixing rings of clay on top of each other.
Kneading	Squeezing or pressing together using the hands and fingers.
Carving	Using tools to scrape away some of the materials.
